

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[STATE] OF INDEPENDENT FILM by Langley McArol

The past several months have proven to be a challenge for the mainstream Entertainment Industry, whether it's feature film or television episodic. The query of individual State film/TV tax incentives have befuddled nearly everyone, including those who implement them. The basic fact is that States without a Tax Incentive package are less likely to attract higher budget projects. Wilmington, NC was once nicknamed "Wilmywood" due to the amount of ongoing production and the amazing crew and talent base residing here. Now that NC no longer has a competitive package, producers have moved the jobs elsewhere. I was recently posed the question; "How has this affected the Independent Filmmakers in North Carolina now that so many of its crew base has moved away?" There are certainly varying opinions on this, but here are my two cents.

First off, NC's crew base has not "moved away." Many have had to get second homes or apartments in other States in order to work, but very few actual NC crew have uprooted their families and moved away. Second, and more to the point, Independent Filmmakers have

always faced enormous challenges when attempting to

get their films made. Whether it's funding a budget, finding crew and actors to commit when they're making so little - if any - payment for their hard work and talent, finding the exact period wardrobe/props/locations or whatever the case may be. The fact that certain local crew are going out of state for work should not keep you from getting your film made. The reason is, just like in Hollywood, there's always someone else willing and able to do the job. If "Joe" isn't available, "Dusty" from UCLA's recent Grad program will work for the fruit on the Craft Service table.

The real challenge that the Filmmaker faces is expanding his circle of friends. Mustering up the confidence to approach someone you don't know well and saying "I have this film that I want to make, and here's why... Will you help me?" I guarantee that if the script is good and you are truly passionate about getting it made, you will find people willing to help you. Passion is contagious. If they say "no thanks", don't sweat it. Move on to the next name on your list, but someone will say "yes". Don't wait for your buddy and his camera to get back from, let's say Atlanta, to get it done. I have called in favors time and again in order to get my short projects made. I am sick and tired of asking my friends for financial donations, but they continue to give because they know, and relate to on some level, my passion. They also know that I don't settle for less than their best. Of course, I don't get the exact same crew every time. I have my loyal compadres, but even they get busy with paid jobs. That's OK. There will, and should, be more films down the road. Just remember, when you do finally have an 'Avengers' sized budget, those people who were loval, stuck to their commitment, communicated, and were all around good to work with had better get, at least, a PA job on your Summer blockbuster. The point is, when it comes to Independent Film-making, you are never alone. There are those who will always support and share your passion. This film festival is proof that when people work together, great and entertaining things can be accomplished. Now, go forth and FILMICATE!

John Warner, founder of Lord-Warner Pictures in Greenville, produced his one theatrical release, *Pitch a Boogie Woogie*, in 1947. Warner had entertained local blacks at his Greenville theater with his own versions of "movies of



local people" as early as the mid-1930s and had dreamed of opening a Hollywood-style studio in Greenville, but it never came to be.

Professor Alex Albright, who uncovered this film while researching North Carolina film history, will be on hand to lead a panel of special guests in a discussion about the film and the greater historical significance of African Americans in cinema. Attendees will also be treated to a tour of the Cape Fear Museum's newest exhibit, REFLECTIONS IN BLACK AND WHITE.


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FAITH and FAMILY BLOCK

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
